#### 156. NOTIFICATION OF INCIDENTS

- 1. It is most important that incidents which involve the civilian population, and might appear in the press or become the subject of criticism or complaint against the Commonwealth Forces are notified immediately to Commanders at all levels.
- 2. All ranks must be fully aware of the importance of avoiding incidents of this nature and of reporting them immediately to their Commanding Officers if they do occur.

#### 158. REGULATIONS FOR SPORT JOURNEYS

- 1. The following procedures are to apply for Australian personnel travelling on sports journeys.
- 2. Travel for competitors and officials will be in accordance with the references where sports are part of Command, District, Divisional or Brigade fixtures.
- 3. When Australian units wish to engage in an inter-unit competition which has not been organized under formation arrangements, service transport is to be utilized. The following procedure is to apply where any one team is required to make round trip exceeding 100 miles.
  - a. Approval to use service transport and service accommodation to be requested from HQ AAF FARFIF SINGAPORE.
  - b. HQ AAF FARELF to be advised:
    - (1) number and names of participants and officials.
    - (2) period sport to be played.
- 4. It is the responsibility of the sub-unit which is to undertake a journey to request and/or supply the necessary information in paragraph 3. Such information should be forwarded in time through Dn MO to allow for reply and for the making of alternative arrangements if requires.
- 5. For Australian inter-unit competitions referred to in paragraph 3 no other means of travel is to be used without prior approval of HQ AAF FARELF.

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#### 159. ADVENTURE TRAINING - PULAU TIOMAN DANGEROUS ROCK WARNING

- 1. It has recently been reported that the rock on The Southern Asses Ear is in a highly dangerous state for climbing. The face is composed of sprung leaves of granite which are in a very unstable condition.
- 2. This warning is based on the opinion of two expert rock climbers and should not be lightly set aside. Sub units are to seek expert advice before proceeding with any Adventure Training Exercise which includes rock climbing on Pulau Tioman.

#### 160. HANDGUARDS FOR RIFLES L1A1

- 1. The above items are in short supply in 3 BOD. To meet outstanding demands, 3 BOD will issue complete laminated sets (left, right and screw).
- In order to make the best use of the wooden type all sub units are to backload to 3 BOD their holdings of all components of the wooden handguards.
- 3. Documentation and packages must be endorsed with the code word "WOODLAM".

#### 161. SMOKING IN ARMY VEHICLES

- 1. Drivers are not to smoke whilst driving an Army Department vehicle.
- 2. Passengers are not to smoke in the driver's cab, in the body of a load carrying vehicle loaded with stores, nor in an empty vehicle when there is a risk of fire (eg patrol vapour present through the nature of previous load).
- 3. The Senior Officer or NCO in a vehicle may, provided he is satisfied there is no risk of fire, allow smoking in a vehicle subject to paras 1 and 2 above. (BRO 53/67)

#### 162. BOUNDS - HELICOPTER SITE

The helicopters site is OUT OF BOUNDS to ALL pers unless on duty.

(BRO 59/67)

#### 163. SALUTING - FLAG CARS

- 1. A car conveying the Brit and Atist High Commissioners flies a Union Flag over the bonnet.
- 2. Car carrying General Officers and Brigadiers exhibit the star plates appropriate to the rank of the passenger. In addition, cars carrying officers holding certain appointments fly flags as detailed in QR's para 993.
- 3. All such cars are to be saluted when the flags or star plates they bear are exposed.
- 4. When travelling in Army transport -
  - (1) The driver of the vehicle is not to salute when the vehicle is in motiron. When the vehicle is stationary, he is to salute by giving an eyes right or left but must not remove his hands from the steering wheel.

- (2) Passengers seated in Army vehicles areto salute as follows:
  - a. Officers are to pay compliments by saluting. If this is not possible they must sit to attention and give an eyes right or left as applicable.
  - b. ORs are to salute with the hand when seated in the passengers seat in the front of the vehicle. When travelling in the rear of the vehicle they are to sit to attention.
- 5. With the large number of visitors to this Garrison who are entitled to display star plates and flags it is essential that due respects are paid to them.
- 6. The Brigade Commander has directed that the attention of all ranks is directed to these orders for strict compliance.

## 164. POSTAL ARRANGEMENTS - FORCES TO FORCES OVERSEAS

Para 1 of DCI (Gen) 19 of 1967 will not apply at present to British Forces in Singapore and West Malaysia pending clarification from MOD.

## 165. GRASS CUTTING - MARRIED QUARTERS

- 1. The following is the policy regarding grass cutting in married quarters/hirings:
  - a. Grass cutting will be paid for out of public funds for:
    - Quarters located within the boundaries of a Garrison.
    - (2) Quarters built on MOD (Army) land.
  - b. The areas to be cut inculde all land, drain, verges, surrounds and rough ground lying adjacent to the quarters extending up to the lawn/land within the perimeter of each house. The land within the perimeter of a house is entirely the responsibility of the occupant.
  - c. Where no clear division is evident to indicate the lawn/ land within the perimeter of the house, this is to be taken as the area of lawn/land immediately adjacenet to the house extending to the first natural obstacle such as a monsoon drain or hedge, or to a distance of twenty yards from the house, whichever is the lesser. Where cases of doubt exist the exact perimeter is to be defined by the Depot Supt., MPBW in consultation with MQI.
  - d. The grass land within the perimeter of a house may be cut and paid for out of public funds in cases where the house is left vacant for six weeks or more. In such cases the cut will normally be made immediately prior to the march-in of the new tenant.

#### 168. MAKING OF WILL BY MEMBERS ON FULL TIME DUTY

#### Reference: MBI 212-3

- 1. Every member on full time duty who is eligible to do so is advised either to take a valid WILL or satisfy himself that he has already made a valid WILL.
- 2. A valid WILL can be made by any member who has reached the age of 21 years. A member under that age is NOT eligible to make a WILL except:
  - a. Under TASMANIAN Law which permits a married male minor 19 years of age and a married female minor 18 years of age to do so;
  - b. In time of war, when, in certain circumstances differing in the various States and Territories, a minor may execute a valid VIII.;
  - c. In time of peace, after having been warned for embarkation for, or whilst serving in:
    - (1) an active service area; or
    - (2) a distributed area, or isolated post where he may be involved in military operations.

# ACTION TO BE TAKEN BY PARENTS IN RELATION TO CHILDREN BORN IN SINGAPORE/MALAYSIA

#### Notification of Birth

- 1. When a child is born to the wife of an Australian Serviceman in a British/Military Hospital, the hospital registers the birth of the child.
- 2. The certificate of Registration of a birth is NOT a Birth Certificate. A Birth Certificate may be obtained by presenting the Certificate of Registration of a Birth to the local Registrar of Births and Deaths accompanied by the necessary fee.

#### Registration of a Child as an Australian Citizen

- 3. A child of an Australian Serviceman who is born in MALAYSIA/ SINGAPORE is, at birth, automatically a British Subject but not an AUSTRALIAN CITIZEN.
- 4. To register a child born in MALAYSIA/SINGAPORE as an Australian Citizen then parents should complete two copies of an application form obtainable from the husband's unit and forward them through the unit to the Australian High Commission, 44 Ampang Road, KUALA TUMPUR, together with the following:

- a. Marriage Certificate.
- b. Child's Birth Certificate.
- c. Two (2) passport sized photographs  $(2" \times 2\frac{1}{2}")$ , of each parent and the child to be registered.
- d. Evidence of the Father's Australian Citizenship. Any of the following documents provide this evidence:
  - (1) Birth Certificate.(2) An extract of Entry
  - (3) Naturalization Certificate.
  - (4) Registration Certificate.
- e. Mother's passport for endorsement.
- 5. The application should be lodged as soon as possible after the birth of the child and in any case not later than six nonths after the date of birth.

#### MALAYSIA ALLOVANCE

6. Immediately a child is born to an Australian Serviceman in MALAYSIA/SINGAPORE, the member must notify his unit. On receipt of the certificate of birth, "Feder tion of Malaya Form A", the member will obtain a Malaysia Pay 3 Forms, "Variation of Malaysia Allowance Advice", and report with both documents to the unit pay representative. The unit pay representative will complete the form Malaysia Pay 3 and make the necessary adjustment to the member's pay and allowances. The certific te of Birth will be returned to the member after action by the unit pay representative.

Search any person, vehicle or vessel seeking to enter, or being in a Protected Area or Place, and they my detain such persons, vehicles or vessels, for the purpose of such search."

#### 189. ADOPTIONS

- 1. All families wishing to adopt a child locally are to give the Commanding Officer four months notice that they intend to apply for an adoption order from the local courts. The notification is to be on the prescribed form, obtainable from the Unit Orderly Room, and is to be completed in triplicate.
- 2. Until authority has been obtained from the Commanding Officer that a child may be taken into the care and possession of a proposed adoptive family it is forbidden for families to accept a child into their quarter from any source whatsoever which they are accepting with a view to subsequent adoption. Breaches of this order may cause an application to be put to Higher Formation that license to occupy married quarters be terminated.
- 3. Applications to adopt a child known to the proposed adopting parents will not be accepted unless:
  - a. At least one of the parents is 25 years old, and is at least 27 years older than the child it is proposed to adopt.

or

b. The applicant is at least 21 and is a relation of the child.

or

- c. The applicant is the natural mother or father of the child.
- 4. Applications by single or married-unaccompanied personnel to adopt a child will not be entertained.
- 5. It is strictly forbidden for any family who have accepted a child with a view to adoption to offer any reward or gift to the person having custody of the child, or for that person to accept such a reward or gift.
- 6. Any breach of the afore mentioned order is a disciplinary offence.

1. The range is situated at GR 047013.

#### $\lambda in$

2. The aim of this ex is to practice rifle sections in night firing, indication and recognition of targets and the execution of relief in place.

#### General Description

3. Sections occupy already prepared wpn pits for a period of two hours before being relieved. During that time targets will appear to their front. Target appearance will be controlled by the firing point officer.

## Conduct

- 4. The plateon to be exercised is to be held in an assembly area approx 250 yds to the rear of the range. The first section will be called forward to occupy the position prior to last light.
- 5. Possible targets will be indicated to the section commander by the firing point officer. It is then the responsibility of that section to pass on all information to the relieving section.
- 6. Scoring will be on a platoon basis. One point per hit.

## Armo and Upns

7. Normal section wons will be used with the following arms scale per section.

9mm BALL - 40 rounds 7.62 mm BALL- 80 rounds Trip Flares - 1 per section 7.62 mm BLANK 12 per section.

## RANGE ORDERS FOR SEC FIELD FIRING RANGE

#### Safety

- 8. Red lamps are to be placed when firing is in progress as follows:
  - a. A sentry with red lamp and radio in communication with firing point is to be stationed at the ELECTRICAL TARGET RANGE road at GR 086998.
  - b. At the firing point.
  - c. Veapons are not to be loaded until section is in position and then only on the order of the firing point officer.
  - d. After the command "load" has been given by the firing point officer, section commanders are given control to enable them to practice fire control orders.
  - e. At the completion of the practice and before relief has taken place, wpns are to be unloaded and inspected by firing point officer.

#### Targets

9. Fig 11 targets are available in the Range Wardens hut. These are to be returned to the warden for repair immediately after use.

#### Scope of Range

10. a. Firing point. The firing point consists of five weapon pits, all of which may be used at the one time. Firing is only to take place from these pits. The arc of fire is as follows:

Left of ARC - 3° (53 MILS)

Right of ARC - 85° (1511 MILS)

- b. Targets. Only the three left hand targets and marker shelters are to be used. The following safety rules apply:
  - (1) No more than two men are to occupy each shelter at any time. Each shelter is to have a radio set.
  - (2) During firing all markers are to remain inside the shelters.
  - (3) No marker is to leave the shelter until ordered to do so by the firing point officer.

#### Orders for Conducting Officer

- 11. Ensure that markers are inside their shelters before the command "load" is given.
  - b. The order for markers to leave shelters is to be given only when weapons are unloaded and have been inspected.

#### Duties of Target Markers

- 12. a. 3 x fig 11 targets per target git are to be used.
  - b. On the command from the conducting officer, the marker is to expose his targets, illuminate them by means of specially prepared torch globes and fire three blank rounds to simulate energy fire.
  - c. 6 x fig 11 targets are to be set up between target lanes at approx 30 yds from weapon mits. These targets are to be illuminated by a trip flare set in the trees on the right of the range and operated by the marker of No 3 target.

#### Suggested Target Appearance Order

## Action of Marker

13. TARGET No 1 No 1 marker exposes targets, illuminates then and fires 3 blank rounds.

TARGET No 2 No 2 marker as above.

TARGET No 3 No 3 marker as above.

#### SHOOTING GALLEY - SIR

1. The shooting gallery range is situated at GR 059 011.

### <u>Ain</u>

2. The aim of the rifle shooting gallery is to teach the soldier to engage various types of tar ets with the rifle, from the shoulder, with speed and accuracy.

#### General Description

3. The soldier is placed on the firing point in a position overlooking the shooting gallery, on which various targets are set up. On an order from the firing point officer, the soldier will have a time limit in which to fire a stipulated number of rounds at the target indicated.

#### Conduct

... The firer is brought to the firing point where he is briefed generally as follows:-

"On the range in front of you, are a number of targets. When I indicate a target (by type and colour) you will fire one round at that target."

5. The object is to give the firer considerable change in ain with each shot. On completion of the practice, the firer is allotted one point for each hit. Arms scale is 10 rds per man.

#### Range Safety







#### SCOUTING LANE 1

#### Ref Map: Malaya 1:25000 Ulu Tiran Range.

#### Location

1. The range is situated at GR 064009.

#### <u>Ain</u>

2. The aim of the scouting lane is to practice the individual in rapidly observing and engaging the type of target he is likely to encounter while being employed as a forward scout.

#### General Description

3. The soldier advances along a set course (or lane) on which are set up a variety of concealed targets. As the targets are exposed, he is required to engage them as rapidly as possible.

#### Conduct

- 4. The troops to be exercised are held in an assembly area, and individuals are called forward as required.
- 5. At the start point the soldier is briefed as follows:
  - a. On the command "load", he will load his OMC with a magazine containing 10 rounds, place the other 10 round magazine in his eqpt.
  - b. When ordered to "advance", he will scout down the lane and whenever a target appears, he will engage it. Two short bursts if possible.
  - c. The scoring will be one point per hit.
- 6. The soldier is then instructed to load and to advance. He will be followed by an instructor. The instructor will be followed by another soldier who will operate targets, reset them, patch out and keep tally of the score.
- 7. On completion of the course the instructor orders the firer to unload and inspects the carbine.

## Safety

- 8. The following safety rules are to be observed during the practice:
  - a. Weapons will be loaded only at the start point and then only on the order of the instructor.
  - b. When are to be unloaded and inspected before the firer returns to the assembly area.
  - c. The firer, the instructor and the soldier keeping score etc are to be the only personnel in the fire lane.
  - d. The upn is to be carried at all times parallel to the ground, with the muzzle pointing in the direction of adv.nce.
  - e. Red warning flag and sentry is to be placed at GR 086 998

## Additional Safety for No 1 Course

9. a. Arcs of fire for scouting lane are:

LEFT OF ARC - 336°

RIGHT OF ARC - 360°

- b. Limit of advance is to be 200 yds from start point.
- c. Five figure targets are to be used. These targets are to be placed no more than 2 yards from the track. Left hand targets are to be placed as low as possible to avoid possibility of stray rounds being fired over crest of the hill on the left.

## Suggested Method of Operating Tats

- 10. a. Set up targets along the track.
  - b. Behind each target place a smallcan half filled with stones.
  - c. Cans can be rattled by means of a string, which is pulled by the scoring soldier.



#### Road Access

2. The road running between GR 1370.1; and GR 080071 only is to be used. This road is not to be used by vehicles over  $\frac{3}{4}$  Ton.

#### Safety Precautions

  - (b) Sat 1200 1400 hrs 1900 - 2330 hrs
  - (c) Sun/Publicl 1200 1430 hrs 1900 2230 hrs.

#### (4) Closing

All members and guests must vacate the Club and be clear of it and the inscidate area:

- (a) By 2300 hrs Daily except SATURDAY MIGHT
- (b) By 2400 hrs SATURDAY NIGHT.
- (5) An extension may be authorised in suitable circumst noes.

#### c. Children

- (1) No child under 11 years of age is allowed on the Club premises or in the pool or immediate area unless accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult.
- (2) No children under the age of 17 years will be allowed in the Elub after 1900 hrs.

## d. Animals

No animals are allowed in the Club or in the outside area where neals are served. All animals found in the Beach Club will be taken away and destroyed.

## e. Swirming Pool

- (1) The Swimming Pool will be open from 1000 hrs to 1900 hrs daily, except Tuesday from 0900 1100 hrs when the pool is closed for cleaning and maintenance.




