General

59. COMMAND

235015 Maj B J FALVEY is appointed Administrative Commander 4 RAR from 1200 hrs 28 Jan 66 to 2400 hrs 30 Jan 66, inclusive, during hospitalization of 3328 Lt Col D S THOMSON MC, CO 4 RAR.

60. BOUNDS - TERENDAK BEACH

1. The area of beach OUT OF BOUNDS for picnics and recreation is now only the area 75 yds each side of the steps leading down from Commonwealth House, and which is bounded by the prominent notice boards.
2. This does NOT debar people from walking along the foreshore in this area.
3. The track leading down from the Medical Sgts Mess remains Out of Bounds to all military and civilian vehicles with the exception of those on duty.

61. POLICY ON BURIALS

1. The text of a press release made by the Acting Minister for Defence 21 Jan 66 is as follows:-

"The bodies of all servicemen who are killed or die overseas may now be returned to Australia at public expense for burial where this is practicable, and if the next-of-kin request that this be done. The Acting Minister for Defence Mr. Alan S. Hulse announced this decision of the government today.

The Government had decided that a service funeral would be conducted in Australia at the cemetery selected by the next-of-kin. If relatives preferred a private funeral, the same assistance would be given by service authorities, as was given in the case of servicemen dying in Australia who were buried privately.

The Acting Minister stated that the new policy would operate immediately. Reimbursement for transport costs would be made to relatives of those soldiers already killed in Vietnam, who had paid to have the bodies returned to Australia.

It might not be practicable to return bodies in some cases owing to the location of casualties. Where bodies had already been buried overseas permission would not be given for them to be returned to Australia for re-interment.

Where relatives decided not to have the remains returned to Australia, the servicemen would be buried with full military honours in an overseas war cemetery.

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3.

Mr Hulme added that the policy of returning deceased servicemen to Australia for burial applied to existing circumstances only. It would be necessary to return to the war-time procedure of burying all casualties in the area of death, if the operational demand on the available transport were to become too great."

62. REMOVALS AT DEPARTMENTAL EXPENSE

1. The attention of all sub-units is drawn to the procedures in the documentation of removals.

2. In recent months submission of MAF H10 have NOT been in accordance with current instructions.

3. The complete documentation required to be submitted to Headquarters Australian Army Force for the movement of effects under various circumstances is as follows:-

a. Rehousing for Departmental Reasons

(1) MAF H10 - two copies

(2) Inventory of major items only - two copies

b. RTA - Member married while in the theatre.

(1) MAF H10 - four copies

(2) Detailed inventory - four copies

(3) Insurance election five copies.

c. RTA - Member married prior to arrival in the theatre  
Insurance election - five copies.

4. Members returning to Australia who have effects stored at public expense in Australia should submit MAF H10 only to their unit, which will forward direct to:

a. The Command where the effects are stored - 3 copies.

b. The Command where delivery is required (if other than the Command of Storage) - 1 copy

c. Headquarters Australian Army Force - 1 copy.

Part C of the MAF H10 should be completed as far as possible but generally the "Address to" and "Date removal required" will have to be entered "to be notified". When the correct information is known the member must then advise the Command concerned.

5. Where a member is rehoused at his own request and NOT for departmental reasons, the removal may be carried out by the departmental contractor but the member will be required to meet all expenses incurred.

6. The insurance of effects during a move at departmental expense as specified in paragraph 3 is arranged by the member and reimbursement of premium is claimed on TS 4 as laid down in Army Headquarters Administrative Instruction 6/64.

7. The insurance of effects during a move NOT at departmental expense is the responsibility of the member and no reimbursement of premium may be claimed.

8. This RO cancels Australian Army Force RO No 5 of Apr 64.

64. ISSUE OF WARRANTS - CIVIL AIR TRAVEL

Air Movement within Malaysia and to Singapore

1. Where members are authorised to move within East and West Malaysia or from points within Malaysia to Singapore the parent unit/formation will normally issue the Civil Air Travel Warrant for the required single or return travel.

2. No warrants for excess or unaccompanied baggage will be issued without prior approval of Headquarters Australian Army Force.

Air Movement Outside Malaysia and Singapore

3. Army movement to destinations outside Malaysia and Singapore will be referred to HQ A.F. who will either arrange this movement and have the tickets available at the departure airport or give detailed instructions to the unit regarding the issue of the CATW.

4. Members moving from Borneo should be ticketed through to destinations in West Malaysia and Singapore when applicable so that they retain the free overseas air baggage allowance on the internal flights. Members returning to Australia from Borneo, however, should be ticketed only as far as Singapore, with HQ A.F. arranging on movement.

5. Warrants for excess and unaccompanied air baggage will be issued by HQ A.F. only. Units are not to move members overseas without HQ A.F. approval.

65. DISCIPLINE - DRIVING LICENCES, INSURANCE AND ROAD TAX

1. The attention of all Military Personnel and their dependants is drawn to Garrison Standing Orders Para 21 h (7) (e) which states:-

- (1) All motor vehs, motor cycles and scooters in Terendak Camp belonging to Service Personnel and their dependants, UK based civilians and civilian Army, and NAAFI employees must, when used within Terendak Camp, be covered by tax and insurance in accordance with the laws of the Federation of Malaya.

(2) All drivers thereof must be in possession of a current Malayan driving licence.

- b. Several instances have occurred of soldiers and families not complying with this order. It should be pointed out that serious disciplinary action will be taken against Military personnel not complying with these orders and in the case of dependants they will not be allowed to drive vehicles in the Camp.

2. It is likely that such visits would be more numerous if travelling arrangements were made easier and, particularly, if the costs were reduced. A chartered aircraft would appear to meet these ends.

3. Our initial enquiries show that the cost of such a flight would be £162,15.0. if sufficient seats were sold. This a disappointingly high figure, especially when compared to the UK charters to Britain, but Australian regulations definitely rule out fares lower than seventy per cent of normal economy fares for charter flights to and from Australia.

4. Charters would be arranged to allow fourteen days in the visited country.

5. Sub-units are to submit Asst Adjt by 1200 hrs 25 Feb 66:

a. Names of members wishing to travel to Australia if a charter is arranged.

b. Numbers of relatives of servicemen who are likely to visit Malaysia/Singapore from Australia.

6. This information is to be as accurate as possible at this stage and all members should be interviewed by an officer to ascertain their willingness to accept this scheme.

## 4. DISCIPLINE - COMMONWEALTH CLUB



General

1. The aim of this instruction is to co-ordinate all administrative aspects of the leave period.
2. The leave period will be from 2400hrs 25 Feb to 2400hrs 11 Mar.
3. All soldiers with current leave credits will go on leave during this period. Exceptions to this are as follows:
  - a. B Coy soldiers who have made leave arrangements for period 14-24 Mar which cannot now be changed.
  - b. Soldiers who for exceptional reasons wish to take their leave at a later date. AAF A88s will be submitted direct to the commanding officer in such cases.
  - c. 4 RAR boxing team.

Command Structure

4. Details of 4 RAR command structure during the leave period are as follows:
  - a. OC Rear Details - Lt P J DESMOND.
  - b. Acting RSM - CSM B Coy.
  - c. Coys - Senior offr or NCO who is remaining behind and NOT going on leave.

Duties during leave period

5. The only duty commitment the unit has during this period is Battalion Duties.
6. CSM B Coy will be responsible to OC Rear Details for the mounting of these duties from 1700hrs 25 Feb to 0800hrs 14 Mar.
7. In view of the large number of soldiers remaining behind from each coy, B Coy will now take its leave with the remainder of the Battalion. Composite duties formed from soldiers who are NOT going on leave will be mounted by CSM B Coy.

24. OC Rear Details will arrange for Rear Details to be paraded daily at 0600hrs. The period 0800-0830 will be used as an Administrative period for the nomination of duties etc.

  - b. Range practices.

27. OC Rear Details will represent OC Admin Coy in this matter. Before leave commences he will obtain a detailed briefing on the subject.

Security

28. The normal security precautions will apply. In particular coys are responsible for the security of their individual arms kotes.

87. TRAFFIC DISCIPLINE - TERENDAK GARRISON

1. It has been noted that an increasing number of drivers in Terendak Garrison are either ignorant of, or are wilfully disobeying, the rules concerning the driving of vehicles when there is a continuous double white line painted in the centre of the road.

2. These rules are contained in Garrison Standing Orders para 21 h 7 (b) and are reproduced below :-

"b. Double White Lines

3. All evidence will be taken on oath.

4. The Court will report its findings on the following points:-

- a. Ascertain and report the cause and general nature of the death.
- b. Ascertain and report whether the deceased was on duty when the injury was sustained and, if on duty the nature of such duty.
- c. Report whether any neglect, misconduct, carelessness or failure to observe any act, regulations, order or instruction, on the part of the deceased, or any other person or persons caused or contributed to the death.
- d. Obtain signed statements from such persons as are able to give material information as to the time, date and place and the circumstances in which the death was occasioned.
- e. Report whether the deceased was at the time:
  - (1) Employed on continuous full-time duty as a member of the ARA, RASR or CMF.
  - (2) Employed as a member of the CMF not on continuous full-time duty.
  - (3) A contributor under the Defence Forces Retirement Benefits Act.
  - (4) Employed on special service within the meaning of the Repatriation (Special Overseas Service) Act.

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- f. Attach to the inquiry written statements and any other relevant documents in such a manner that the AFF D11 is the first.
  - g. Ascertain whether there was any lack of supervision or lack of training or other matters which call for rectification.
  - h. Ascertain whether there was Medical Attention available and speedily obtained.
  - j. Was Private Robinson a capable swimmer and to what standard.
  - k. What attempts were made to save Private Robinson.
  - l. What action was taken to obtain assistance.
  - m. Was any life safety equipment available.
5. The Court will express its opinion as to the cause of the accident and if there was any neglect on the part of any person or persons involved.
  6. The Court will make recommendations as to any practicable means to be taken to prevent a recurrence of a similar nature.
  7.
    - a. The president will furnish copies of the proceedings to the CO 4 RAR for his opinions and recommendations, who will in turn forward completed proceedings to this HQ for the opinion and recommendation of the Brigade Commander.
    - b. Three completed copies of the proceedings will then be forwarded to HQ AUSTARM FORCE FARLF.
    - c. One copy to HQ 17 Div/Malaya District.
