NOTES

1. *Definition of Operational Period.*—The term "operational period" for the purpose of this instruction, means:—
- (a) the period between a declaration of war and the official end of hostilities;
- (b) any period spent in a theatre of operations;
- (c) any period when engaged in any form of military operation.
2. The Ministry of Defence or headquarters concerned will be responsible for instructing units to submit Commanders' Diaries where the conditions of the unit's employment make this necessary. Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.

INVESTIGATIONS FOR DECREASING WEIGHT RAT PACKS

1. The following information has been received by 4RAR from AHQ.

" A trial has been proposed by AFSS to examine the minimum caloric level possible for soldiers serving in SE Asian conditions whilst maintaining their level of operational effectiveness. The net gain from such a study is a reduction of the weight of combat rations. In addition a requirement for a special patrol ration, of light weight, also exists and these two problems are complementary.

A basic difficulty in examining such a problem is that no centralized data exists on what soldiers, do in fact choose to carry and eat. Information gathered from 3 Rat members indicate that roughly only between a third and two thirds of ration packs were chosen for patrol work plus other items. Precise information is of course now unavailable. Their reports also indicate wide differences in terms of food preferences between different individuals and also for any one individual over a number of patrols."

2. Coys are to submit the following information by mail at the conclusion of each patrol :-

a. Short detail of patrol - e.g. 2 days patrol through primary jungle - 2 days in ambush position - 3 days patrol through thick secondary.

b. Rat carried by individual in tabulated form. An example is as follows.

INTEREP NO 1

GENERAL

1. The enemy appear to have vacated KINDAU and occupied an area to the SOUTH WEST.
2. No firm indications have been received of 514 Bn occupying a forward line on the S. KOEMBA in the SIDING area.
3. Further reports of mines have been received, plus the finding of two parts of a PM - 1 mine on the RAYA ridge.
4. A report/possible incursion by five Chinese on about 1 May 66. Subsequent deployment/both SF and police has not led to the discovery of these men.

NEW CAMP AT SEDJARAU

- F3. 11 - 15 Apr.
BRIMOB are now making camp in an area known as SEDJARAU, which is SOUTH of BELIDA.
6. B2. 22 Apr 66.
Due to evacuation of KINDAU by BRIMOB, several families have returned to the old kpg. Patrolling PELOPOR troops visited KINDAU/BELIDA/SEDJARAU at irregular intervals. The PELOPOR are based at SELIAS, and the length of patrol is usually 7 - 10 days.
7. B2 A new BRIMOB camp is in the general area of GR 8949, about 1½ hrs journey from BABANG. The camp is some distance from the kpg of SEDJARAU, but on the S. SEDJARAU. It is of rough construction.
8. F3. In late Mar, troops from KINDAU moved SOUTH to SEDJARAU. On 25 Apr the construction of a hut took place in a position between BELIDA and an unnamed kpg. Civilians assisted in the construction, which has since been occupied by two sections from SEDJARAU. No defences were seen.

COMMENT

9. The source indicated the unnamed kpg is in area GR 89510. This could mean the new hut is in the NW corner of Grid Square 8850, and is an outpost of the new BRIMOB position.
10. The exact location is not known. One kpg SEDJARAU is shown on the 1:250,000 map as being at 8050. The SEDJARAU referred to in the report should be in the area 8849 or 8949.

SELUAS - SIDING

11. B2. Towards the SIDING area there are BRAWIDJAJA soldiers, dressed in green uniforms. Weapons seen were ARMALITES, KALASHNIKOVs and BRENS.
12. A 12.7 HAAMG, unmanned, was nearby on the EAST side of the road, and not in a prepared position.
13. BRIMOB in SELUAS are very short of rations and are borrowing rice from the BRAWIDJAJA troops at BANGUM. They do NOT provide food for the IBT, have removed their arms, and are most unkind to them.
14. B2. 18 Apr. 60 - 70 BRAWIDJAJA troops were observed in SELUAS. They wore the BRAWIDJAJA insignia but no Bn number was seen. The troops stated they were going to the SIDING area. BRIMOB in BANGUNG also stated BRAWIDJAJA troops would take over in the SIDING area. There are NO signs of military occupation from TADAN to SELUAS.
15. C3. A local from MAJA bearing ^agrudge against TNI stated NO troops had been in the area MAJA - SIDING for a number of months. If they come, he would inform SF at GUMBANG.
16. F3. 15 Apr. There are BRAWIDJAJA troops at BANGUM, numbers unknown, reported to be for duty in the SIDING area. They wear a KODAM 8 insignia on their OG shirts, and POLISI on their caps.
17. COMMENT
BRAWIDJAJA troops wearing POLISI on their caps is NOT understood.
18. F3. Three launches full of kit for the BRAWIDJAJA troops arrived at BANGUM on 13 Apr from SANGAU. On the floor of another launch could be seen two long gun barrels.
19. Two similar barrels described as about six feet long tapering from six to four inches approx, were being cleaned on the river bank by a party of soldiers. What was described as metal plates could be seen nearby. An 81mm mortar, complete was also seen. Source states the barrels described were not 81mm.
20. COMMENT
NO reports have been received to indicate SIDING, MAJA or P. RUNDANG have been reoccupied. On the contrary, friendly locals/traders from SIDING area stated soldiers have not been in SIDING area for a number of months. It is considered SIDING is not occupied, but the enemy could be deploying forward using an inland route.

BABANG

21. B2. On 10 Apr, 40 PF DPOR came from SELUAS to the BABANG area, and then went towards KINDAU. Source could not say whether they were replacements or reinforcements. Dress was described as helmets, camouflage suits, jungle boots. Each man had a KALASHNIKOV and was equipped with a large pack. rifle

22. The party carried wooden battens about 15 in X 4 in X $\frac{1}{2}$ in, and attached to the batten was a small bomb about the size of a cigarette packet with a length of wire wrapped around the batten. They also carried GRENADES, Rifle HEAT M31.
23. B2. On 1 Apr 40 PELIPOR left RISAU for SELUAS, they may be replaced by new men.
24. F3. There are 20 BRIDMOB SOUTH of RISAU near the G. BRUNEI feature.
25. COMMENT.

This could be a new camp area or a patrol. Further info is being sought.

ARTY

26. B2. A short time prior to 19 Apr three guns were sighted in SELUAS now there are only two. It has been heard that one of the guns was being sent to RISAU.
27. F3. 11 Apr. There are two field guns, one on either side of the road from SANGAU as it enters the kpg at SELUAS. Although the working parts were covered, the wheels and trails were similar to the US 105 mm.
28. F3. 2 May. Three guns are at present in SELUAS.
29. COMMENT

It is possible that the guns could be US 105mm, already identified on other fronts. However the guns have probably not fired for over two months. This may be due to the lack of ammunition, or fear of retaliation.

MINES

30. F3. On 12 - 15 Apr, NYONAU, a Land Dayak from BADANG, accompanied a patrol on the INDONESIAN side of the JAGOI ridge in the general area bordering the primary jungle. Source was told to warn the SERIKIN villagers.
31. On 11 May, a top part of a YUGOSLAVIAN PMA - 1 mine was found at GR 910573.
32. On 12 May, a lower part of a YUGOSLAVIAN PMA - 1 mine was found four feet from the top half.
33. COMMENT
Initial examination indicated the top half was relatively new, compared to the lower half, which had probably been in location for over 3 months. Result of expert inspection to follow.
34. C3. On 24 Apr. 15 members of 514 Bn from BOMBOENG were guided by CHONG AH KWAN (IBT) to SELOEDJIT to inspect the kpg and previous military accommodation. It is reported SELOEDJIT may be garrisoned in the future if they have enough men.
35. C3. 56 soldiers from 514 Bn are stationed at BOMBOENG with a Sgt in charge. At least 20 - 25 of these are INDON MALAYS. The soldiers occupy three civilian houses in the kpg, are dressed in OG's and are armed with Garands and M1.45's. Source overheard a civilian from BOMBOENG state the soldiers at the kpg were from SILLIWANGI SECTION No 4.

SECRET

36. COMMENTS.

Previous numbers reported in DOMBOENG have been 46, and between 49 - 50. The mention of a Sgt in charge probably indicates a pl position. The report of SILLIWANGI does/coincide with the current assessment of the troops being from 514 BRAWIDJAJA Bn. /not

37. The source travelled via SEBOEDJIT, LAMANG, KAPOET to TRINGGUS SANG. He did not visit SIDING. The only report of military activity was at SEBOEDJIT.

PELOPOR CAMPS

38. F3. During Apr, 37 PELOPOR moved from RISAU kpg along the RISAU - BABANG track and occupied a camp. They carried SA, but NO mortars were seen

39. F3. Approaching from RISAU direction there are two buildings housing 20 PELOPOR on the left of the track, and one building housing 7 on the right. Weapons seen by source were KALASHNIKOV, SIMENOV and an unidentified rifle.

40. F3. 20 PELOPOR are in a camp at the junction of the RISAU - SELUAS track with the track leading NORTH to BELIDA.

41. COMMENT

Approx area grid square 8846 as shown on a 1:250,000 map.

POSSIBLE INCURSION

42. C3. Five PGRS left SELUAS on 29 Apr and arrived the same day at KINDAU where they spent two nights. On 1 May, the 5 PGRS left KINDAU, stating they were going into SARAWAK. All were Chinese dressed in civilian clothing, carrying SA and Grenades. SEKSI at BABANG asked source to check if in fact they had crossed the border. Civilians from KINDAU said they had seen 5 armed Chinese near KINDAU on 29 Apr.

4. COMMENT

With SF deployed along the border during 1 - 2 May, it is considered if the enemy entered SARAWAK about this time they would have crossed the RAYA ridge WEST of the 935 EASTING. Subsequently deployed (Op HAYSTACK) yielded nil distinguishable tracks.

44. The top half of the PMA - 1 mine (ref para 27-29) which was located may be associated but this is by no means certain.

45. This report is thought to be accurate and bears resemblance to an Interrogation report (BM 4 to 10701 of 26 Apr). It is thought these may be the four who left SARAWAK for INDONESIA in Dec for further training, and now endeavouring to return.

46. Joint investigation by SF and Police continues.

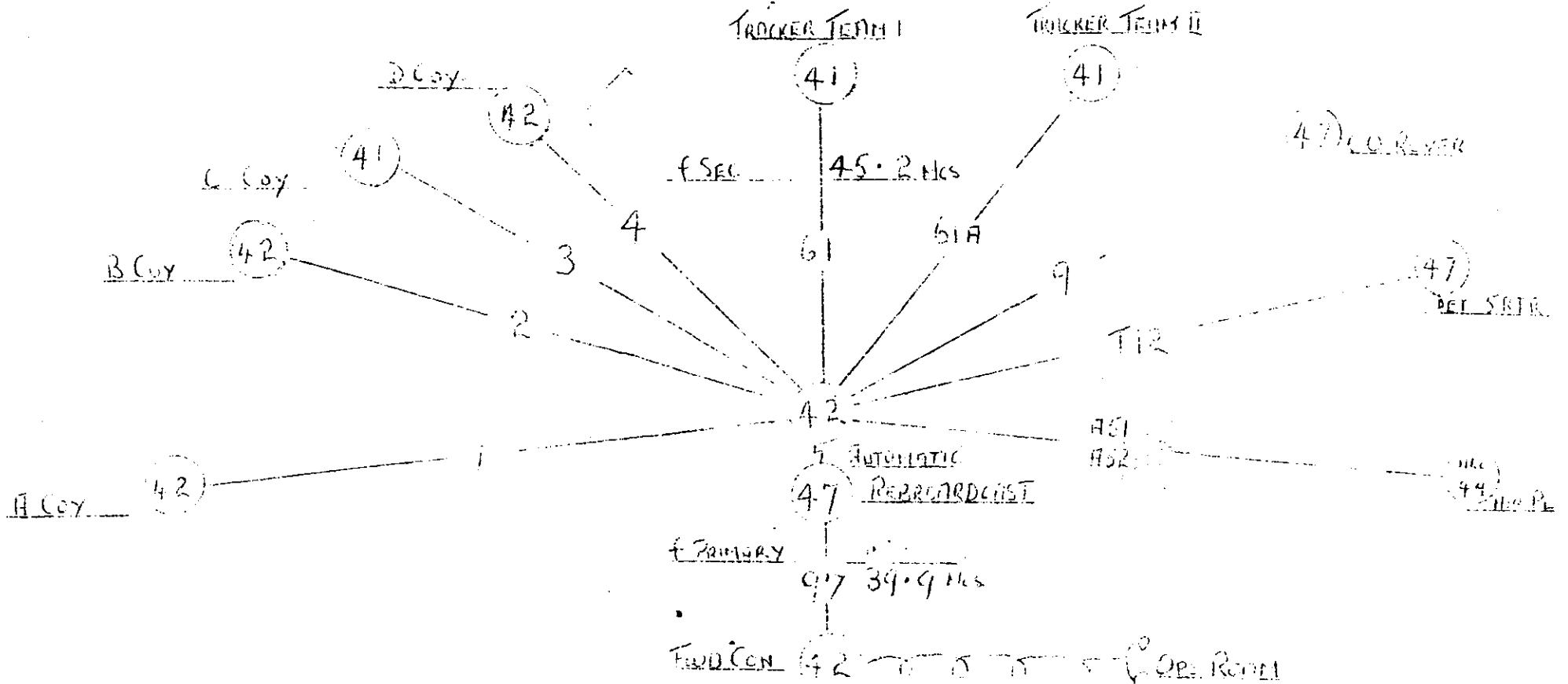

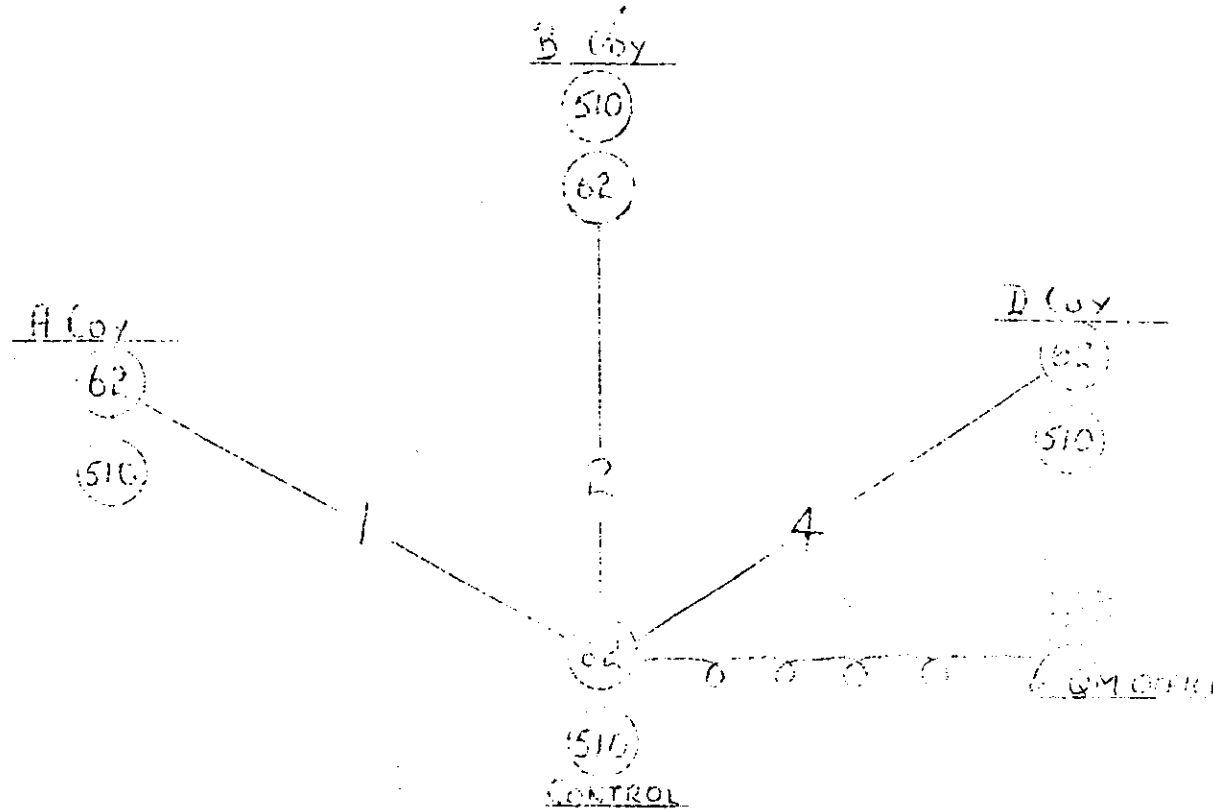

173. ARMALITE RIFLE AR 15 - SAFETY ON LOADING

1. Following a report that an armalite rifle discharged a round without the trigger being depressed, a thorough trial has been carried out to determine whether this is possible.
2. The trial showed that there is a slight possibility that if the same round is repeatedly loaded into the rifle then the action of the floating firing pin on the cap of the round may cause an accidental discharge.
3. The attention of all units is to be drawn to this potential danger and in particular the necessity for ensuring that:
 - a. The normal safety drills when loading and handling loaded weapons are strictly adhered to.
 - b. The number of times that the same round is reloaded into the top of the magazine and therefore into the chamber is kept to a minimum.

174. PARKING OF MILITARY VEHICLES AT CIVIL AIRPCHT -- KUCHING

1. Military vehicles are not to be parked and left unattended in the VIP parking space at the main entrance to the civil airport. Passengers departing by civil flight may be dropped at the main entrance; but vehicles are to be parked in the spaces provided elsewhere.
2. Failure to observe this simple rule adds significantly to the already congested entrance, particularly between 0900 hrs and 1000 hrs daily.

1. Hats will be worn at all times in vehicles.

176. ADJUSTMENT OF LOSS OR DAMAGE ITEMS ON PERSONAL ISSUE (CLO/EQUIPMENT)

1. The Commanding Officer under authority of ARO 5/66 and Equipment Instruction 1964 para 18.23 delegates authority to sub-unit commanders and the Quartermaster to decide whether items lost or damaged should be a charge against the member or public funds.
2. Members holding the above appointments may sign Loss and Damage Reports or AAF F203 (COs Authority for Issue) for items on personal issue. (Clothing and Equipment).
3. This authority does not cover control store items e.g. compasses, binoculars, weapons etc.

177. RELIEF OF INDIVIDUAL OTHER RANKS - FARELF

- a. MBI 16-1.
 - b. AHQ Administrative Instruction 6/64.
 - c. HQ AAF Routine Order Part I 6/66.

General

1. Personnel may be returned to Australia for any of the reasons mentioned in the abovequoted references.
2. The conditions governing tours of duty in the FARELF area are set out in references a. and b. Applications for extension or restriction of tour should be submitted, six months in advance, in the form required by paragraph 12 of reference a. It is not necessary for an application for an extension to be made when a member wishes to remain in Malaya/Singapore area for more than 2 but less than 2½ years.
3. Arrangements for individual relief of members stationed in Eastern Malaysia or Hong Kong will be in accordance with Parts 6 and 7 of reference b.
4. A member serving a normal tour of duty other than in Eastern Malaysia or Hong Kong will be relieved, unless an extension is approved, during the period 2 to 2½ years after his arrival. His replacement is usually demanded by Headquarters Australian Army Force before the two year period has elapsed, so that a period of six months will be available for the replacement to arrive and the relief to take place. Generally, the relief will occur in the first two months after the two years has elapsed, but the member being relieved cannot consider himself entitled to return to Australia in under 2½ years.

Procedure for Personnel who RTA on Completion of Tour of Duty

5. AAF Form A6 (Annex 'C' to reference b.) is to be completed and forwarded to Headquarters Australian Army Force, FARLEF, in triplicate, at least four months before a member completes the minimum period of his tour of duty. The month during which the replacement is required is to be stipulated in Part 3 of the form. In the case of a member serving in the Malaya/Singapore area, this is to indicate whether or not he should remain for more than 2 but less than 2½ years.

178. INCOME TAX - SERVICE IN VIETNAM AND BORNEO

1. Approval has been given for pay and allowances paid to a member in ARL, remote locality leave, or leave for duty on rest days, on holidays to be exempt from income tax provided such leave accrued from a period of service which qualifies as special service for income tax purposes. This approval applies whether or not the payment is made while a member is serving in a prescribed area.

2. Details of administrative procedures will be advised in due course.
