1. To detail the admin sp nec for Ex "BAPTISM".

Gen Outline

2. Apart from MCV lifts to, during and at the end of the exercises, 4 RAR will exercise on restricted MRT veh scales, vide Annex 'A' with operational scalings of rat, POL and expense sups.

Rear Details

4. Rear details will parade on the Bn Parade Ground at 0900 hrs Fri 19 Nov. They will assume all duties after 1630 hrs that day and remain on duty till 0800 hrs 2 Dec when they will be relieved by A Coy.
5. On the absence of OC Rear Party, the Asst Adjt will assume comd of the Rear Details.

Armo

6. No ball armo is to be taken on the exercise.

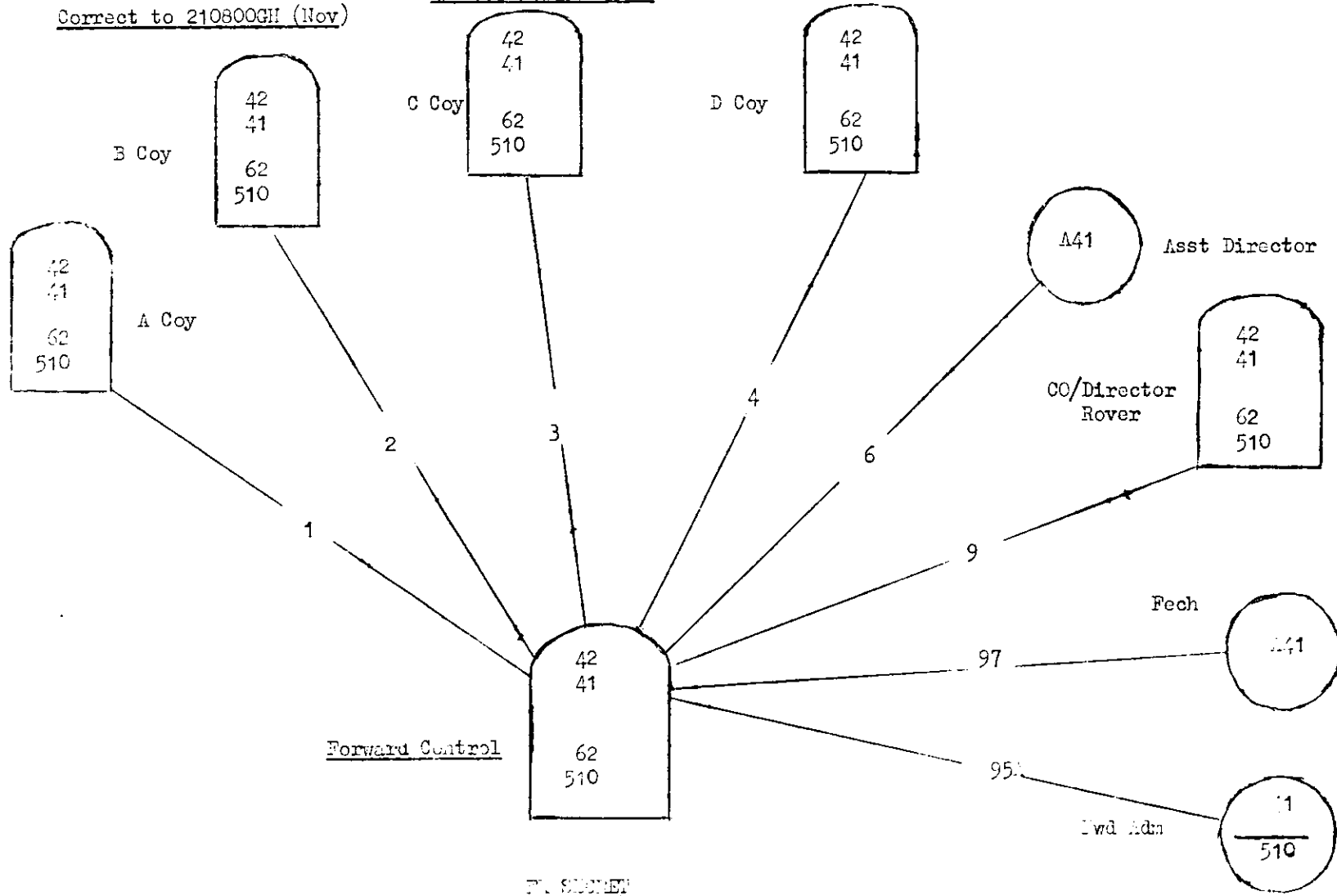

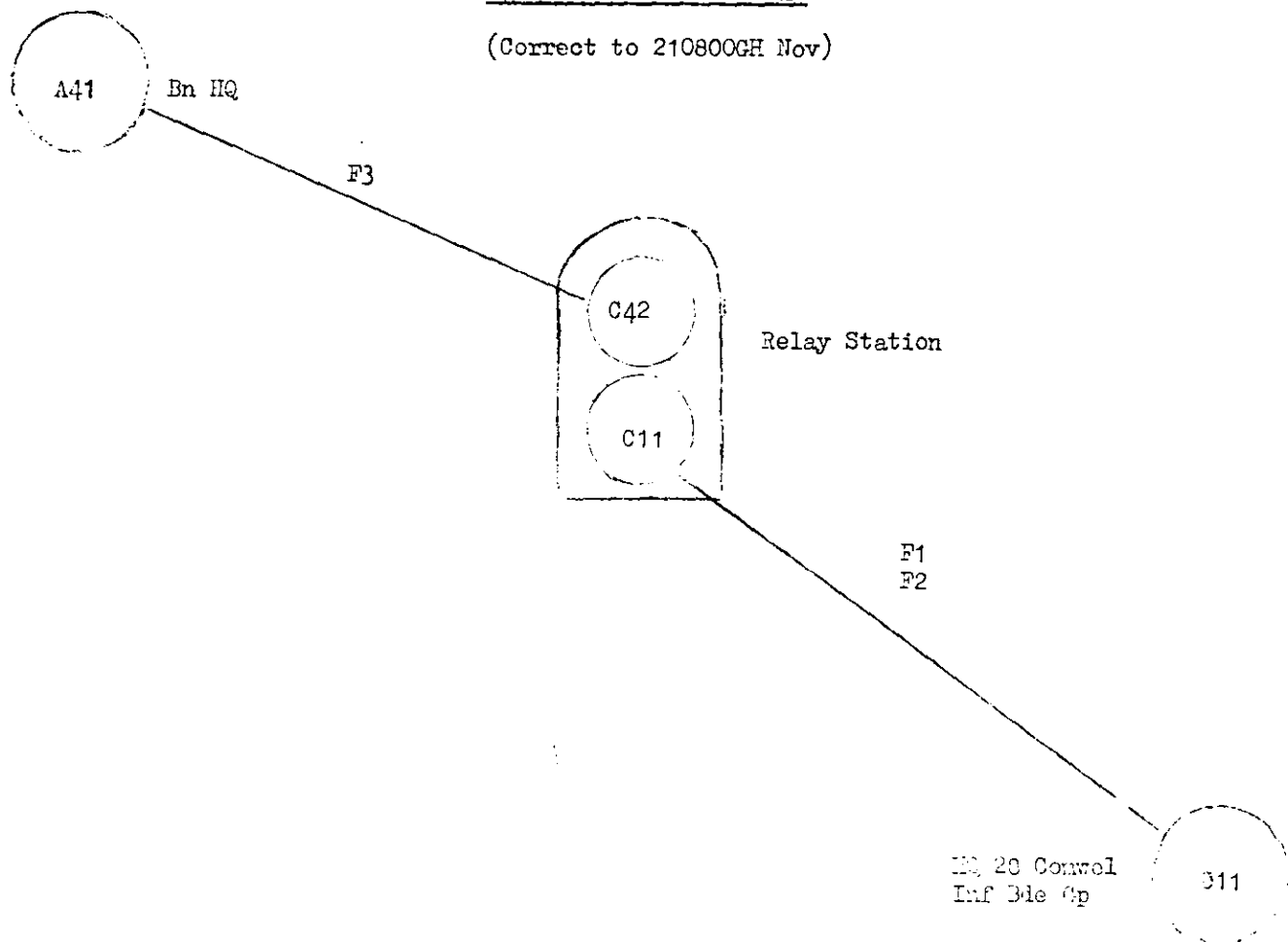

(Correct to 210800GH Nov)



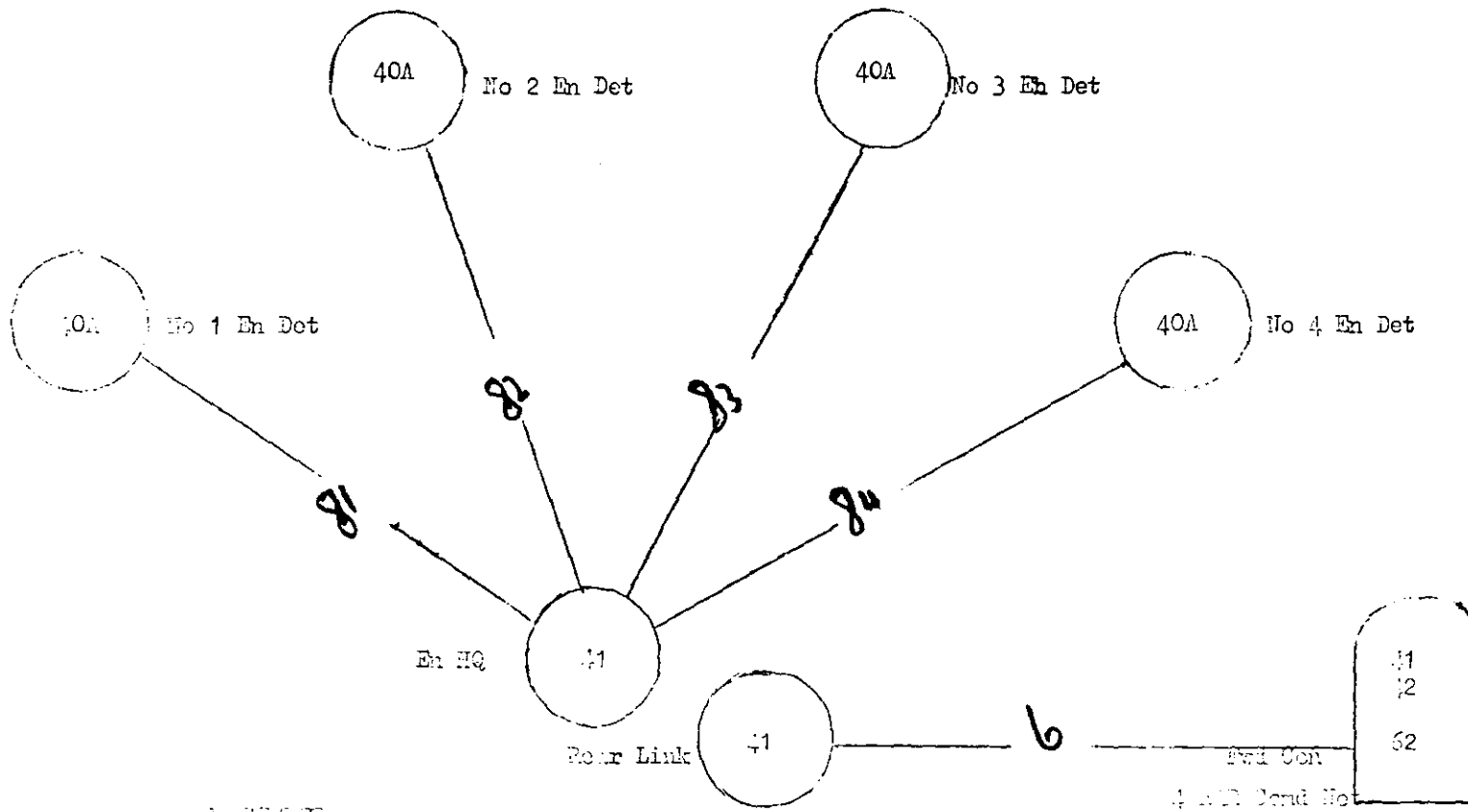

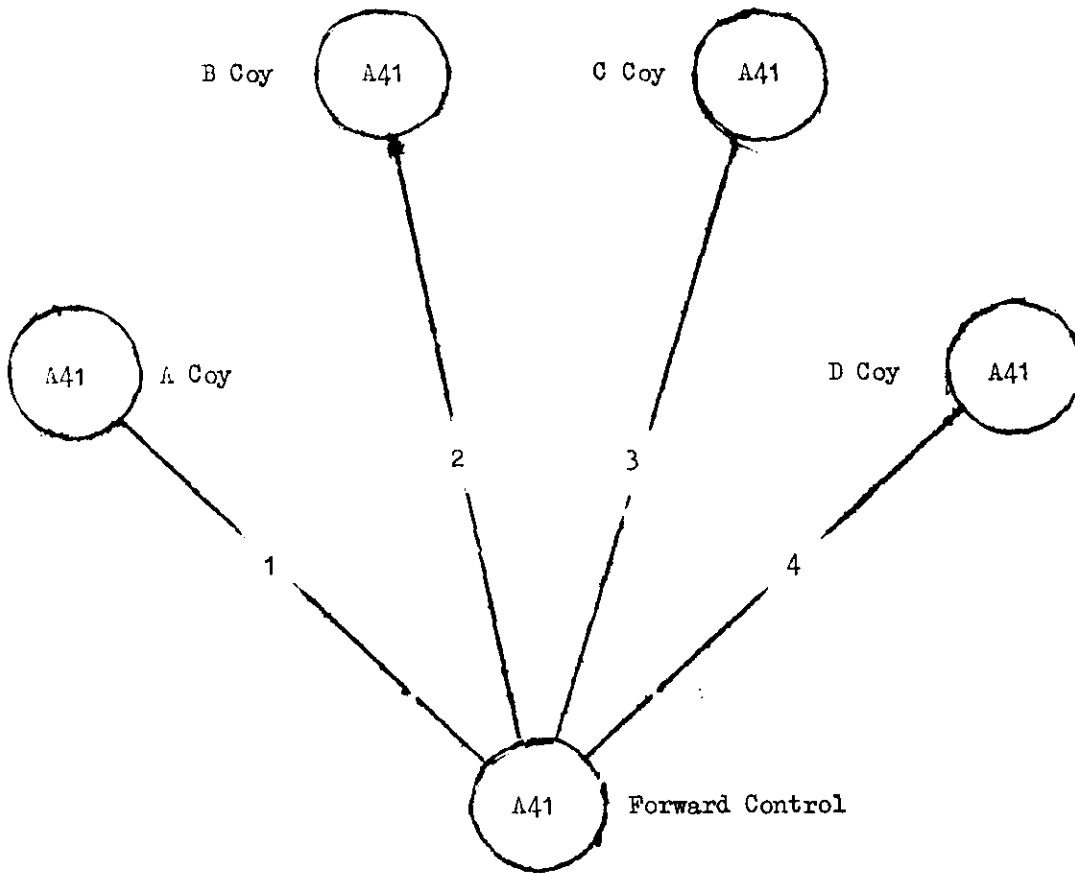

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS - EX BULL ROARER II
6 -10 DEC 65

General

1. This exercise will be divided into two phases.
 - a. 6-9 Dec - mobilisation, move to and staging in SINGAPORE followed by an air move back to MALACCA.
 - b. 7-10 Dec - one sided exercise with troops in the ASAHAN RANGES.
2. The period 7-9 Dec overlaps in that some sub-units will have moved to MALACCA whilst others will be still in SINGAPORE awaiting the air move.
3. The following units will be taking part in the exercise and come under command of 4 RAR:
 - a. Tp 4 RTR.
 - b. A Fd Bty RAA.
 - c. Tp 11 Indep Fd Sqn.
 - d. Section 16 COMVEL Fd Amb.

Visual Exercise

4. These are to practise the following:
 - a. 4 RAR group in its likely task in the event of limited war operations in SOUTH EAST ASIA.
 - b. Mobilisation procedures in TERENDAK.
 - c. Planning and execution of air movement of personnel and vehicles.
 - d. A quick approach march to and occupation of a defensive position.
 - e. The control of mobile operations including an armoured car screen with artillery in support.
 - f. The control, employment and co-ordination of close air support, artillery and battalion support weapons in defensive operations.
 - g. The planning of a counter attack and the execution of the fire plan in its direct support.

Air Support

5. The RAF will support 4 RAR by the provision of:
 - a. TAC 1 (MR) aircraft on 6-9 Dec.
 - b. Offensive air support on 8-10 Dec.

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6. One Sioux from 45 Lt Regt will be in support on 7 Dec.

Ammunition

7. Ammunition details as follows:
 - a. No blank ammunition will be carried.
 - b. The only live ammunition carried in operational vehicles will be as follows:-
 - (1) HE - 75 rounds per mortar.
 - (2) Smoke - 10 rounds per mortar.
 - (3) 120mm HEESH - 3 rounds per WOMBAT.
 - c. Vehicles on MRT scale will be loaded with boxes weighed and labelled to simulate the normal ammunition scale. These boxes are to be stacked in vehicle lots to the rear of the guard room.
 - d. The RSM is to arrange for unit first line ammunition to be delivered to the echelon area by 1700hrs 6 Dec 65 excluding that listed above.

Fuel

8. Details as follows:
 - a. No bulk stocks will be required.

Despite the internal unrest caused by the recent coup. The enemy increased subversion throughout the months of Oct and early Nov.

Infiltration of cadre cells and agents into Malaysia must have been more successful than previously thought because by mid Nov intelligence estimates rated the Gemas State Forest and Extension as an effective enemy base area. The estimated enemy strength was a minimum a strong company consisting of approximately the equivalent of a platoon or regulars with the remainder reasonably well trained local volunteers.

To cope with the threat 28 COMWEL Inf Bde Gp was deployed as follows:-

1. It has been reported that damage has been caused to the Blank Firing Attachments for the 7.62 mm Bren by unauthorised stripping.

3. The appropriate Infantry Training Pamphlets will be amended in due course.

381. MOVEMENT OF VEHICLES AND STORES BY SEA

Reference to Standing Instr for Mov No 2 of 10 Nov 64, paras 6 a, and 6 b.

- a. Several instances have occurred recently in the case of vehicles and unit stores being submitted for shipment while still containing either explosives or hazardous materials.
- b. In some of these cases unit certificates have been received by JSPU stating that there were no explosive or hazardous contents contained therein.
- c. This practice is extremely dangerous and could well lead to a major disaster.
- d. Disciplinary action will be taken against the officer signing unit certificates should any further instances occur.

382. LEAVE TRAVEL - REIMBURSEMENT OF FARES

All claims for reimbursement of fares in connection with leave must be certified as shown below:

"I certify that the journey from TRENDAK to..... (Destination) and return was in fact undertaken by me, and that passengers for whom claim is made were in fact carried, and that the travel was not in connection with leave taken outside of MALAYSIA.

384.

SALUTING

General

1. The standard of saluting is not in all cases as good as it should be. It has been particularly noticed that the saluting of Staff Cars and the saluting of officers of or seconded to the Federation Military Forces is neglected.
2. In order to maintain a high standard it is essential that any Officer, Warrant Officer or NCO observing a fault in saluting should immediately take energetic action to correct it and to prevent its repetition.
3. A summary of orders relating to saluting are produced below. These instructions are to be imparted to all ranks at frequent intervals during training and the points as amplified below are to be particularly emphasised during such instruction.

Staff Cars

- a. A car conveying the British High Commissioner flies a Union Flag over the bonnet.
- b. Cars carrying General Officers and Brigadiers exhibit the star plates appropriate to the rank of the passenger. In addition, cars carrying officers holding certain appointments fly flags as detailed in AMR & O.
- c. All such cars are to be saluted when the flags or star plates they bear are exposed.

Officers of the Federation of Malaysia Armed Forces

5. All officers of the Armed Forces of the Federation of MALAYSIA, whether seconded from the British Service or commissioned by the Government of the Federation are to be paid the same compliments as officers of equivalent rank in the Australian Army.
6. The badges of rank worn by officers of the Federation Armed Forces are generally similar to those worn by officers of equivalent rank in the Australian Services.

Colours

7. Compliments to be paid to uncased standards, guidons and colours, and to the Queen's Truncheon of 2 GR.

The National Anthem

8. Compliments are to be paid when the National Anthem is played, except that, whenever the National Anthem is played as part of a salute or on a parade other than a Church Parade, all ranks in military uniform, not under the orders of an OC parade, are to salute.

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... components are to be paid when the National Anthem of the Federation of Malaysia, or the State Anthem of any of the States of the Federation of Malaysia is played.

386. EXEMPTION FROM AD-VALOREM REGISTRATION TAX ON PRIVATE MOTOR VEHICLES

1. Since MALAYSIA DAY 16 September 1963, certain provisions of the Anglo Malayan Defence Agreement are to apply to both SINGAPORE and MALAYA.

2. Under paragraph 4 Section 6 of Annex 3 of the Defence Agreement, exemption from the Ad Valorem Registration Tax, payable when a vehicle is licensed, on private motor vehicles may be claimed by any member of the Commonwealth Naval Land and Air Forces, or by component of such forces. No claim may be made by any member of the Malaysian Armed Forces or by citizens of MALAYA or SINGAPORE employed by the forces.

3. The regulations permit the importation of a new and unregistered motor vehicles or the initial registration of a motor vehicle purchased in MALAYA or MALAYA without payment of this tax.

4. Claims for exemption or refund of tax already paid must be submitted within three months of the applicant's first arrival in SINGAPORE or MALAYA. Claims should be submitted, on a proforma as at Annex 'A' to this order.

Personnel in MALAYA: The Commissioner for Road Transport, KUALA LUMPUR.

Personnel in SINGAPORE: The Registrar of Vehicles, Middle Road, SINGAPORE 2.

5. Claims for exemption need not be related to a specific car which the claimant intends to buy. A claimant who does not intend to buy a car for say 6 months or a year after arrival, may put in for exemption within 3 months of arrival, and use such exemption at a later date when a car is actually bought.

6. Should a member of the overseas Commonwealth Forces, or the civilian component, wish to sell or transfer a vehicle on which exemption has been granted, the exemption continues if the vehicle is disposed of to another member of such Forces or civilian component who has not previously been granted a similar exemption and who has applied for and been granted that exemption in the usual manner but has not yet acquired a vehicle. However, if the vehicle is to be disposed of to any other person the vehicle will become liable to ad valorem registration fees assessed on the value of the vehicle at the time of disposal.

387. DISCIPLINE

1. From time to time members of 4 RAR are individually admitted to British Military Hospitals, spend leave at British Leave Centres, attend courses at British Service Schools or are processed through British Transit Camps in FAR EAST LAND FORCES.

2. Should such servicemen be alleged to have committed a military offence the Commanding Officer of British Unit will :

a. Inform the soldier that :

- (1) He is considered to have committed a military offence.
- (2) A report will be submitted to 4 RAR.
- (3) He will be returned to 4 RAR at the earliest practical moment for investigation of the report.

b. The Commanding Officer of the British Unit will use his discretion, having regard to the exigencies of the service, as to when the soldier is to be returned to 4 RAR. However, in the interests of the soldier he should be returned at the earliest practical opportunity.

3. The British Commanding Officer will ensure that a written report signed by him personally together with signed statements by witnesses and where appropriate a certified copy of any unit order allegedly contravened is submitted to 4 RAR as soon as possible. 4 RAR is responsible for framing appropriate charges under Australian service law and requesting the attendance of any witnesses that may be required.

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4. Should it be necessary to arrest the Australian soldier or escort him back to his parent unit this must be carried out by either:

- a. United Kingdom, Australian or New Zealand Provost personnel but not Gurkha Military Police, or;
- b. Any Australian Officer, Warrant Officer or NCO by rank.

5. For the purpose of para 4 b above it can be generally accepted that a military offence under the Army Act 1955 (is the Army Act applicable to the UK Forces) would also be an offence against Australian Service Law.

6. Certain special provisions under the Defence (Visiting Forces) Act 1963 make it possible to "dispose" of members of 4 RAR to the British Army under some circumstances, eg long term detachment. These members then become subject to British discipline and would be dealt with by their British Commanding Officer. However, these cases would be the exception and members of 4 RAR concerned would be notified of their legal position.

TRAVEL WARRANTS

1. Members may be granted a free return travel warrant twice each year to visit leave destinations within the territories of the Federation of Malaya (excluding the Border Areas of MALAYA as defined) and SINGAPORE. There is now no restriction to specified places as existed previously.
2. Certain areas or destinations within the territories of the Federation of Malaya or Singapore may be restricted as leave destinations from time to time. These restrictions will be advised in Routine Orders as they occur. Travel warrants will not be issued to areas or destinations so restricted.
3. For members wishing to proceed to a destination beyond the territories of the Federation of Malaya and Singapore approval must be obtained from HQ Australian Army Force FRELF.
4. The following restrictions will apply with respect to the issue of free warrants:-
 - a. The year term commences from date of arrival in SINGAPORE/MALAYA.
 - b. In principle no member should receive his first free travel warrant until he has been in the theatre for 3 months.
 - b. No more than two free travel warrants will be issued to any member per year. Married members

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may use both free travel entitlements to include their wives on OML occasions during the year.

d. If a duplicate free travel warrant should not be issued to any person within 3 months of a previous issue of a free travel warrant or mileage allowance certificate in lieu.

e. To qualify for free travel warrant a member must be granted at least 7 days leave.

5. Approval may be given for personnel to travel by civil aircraft. Personnel will purchase their own return tickets and make their own reservations. On return from leave, claims may be submitted for refund of air fare, or equivalent rail fare at entitled rate, whichever is the lesser amount. Cost of sleeper berths, if the journey is such that a sleeper would be necessary, may be claimed but charges for cancellations of bookings may not.

6. A claim for refund must be supported by the triplicate copy of the air ticket. The form TS 4 will be certified as follows :-

"Certified that (No, Rank, Name) travelled by air during authorised leave, was entitled to an issue of a free travel warrant, and details have been entered in Unit Register."

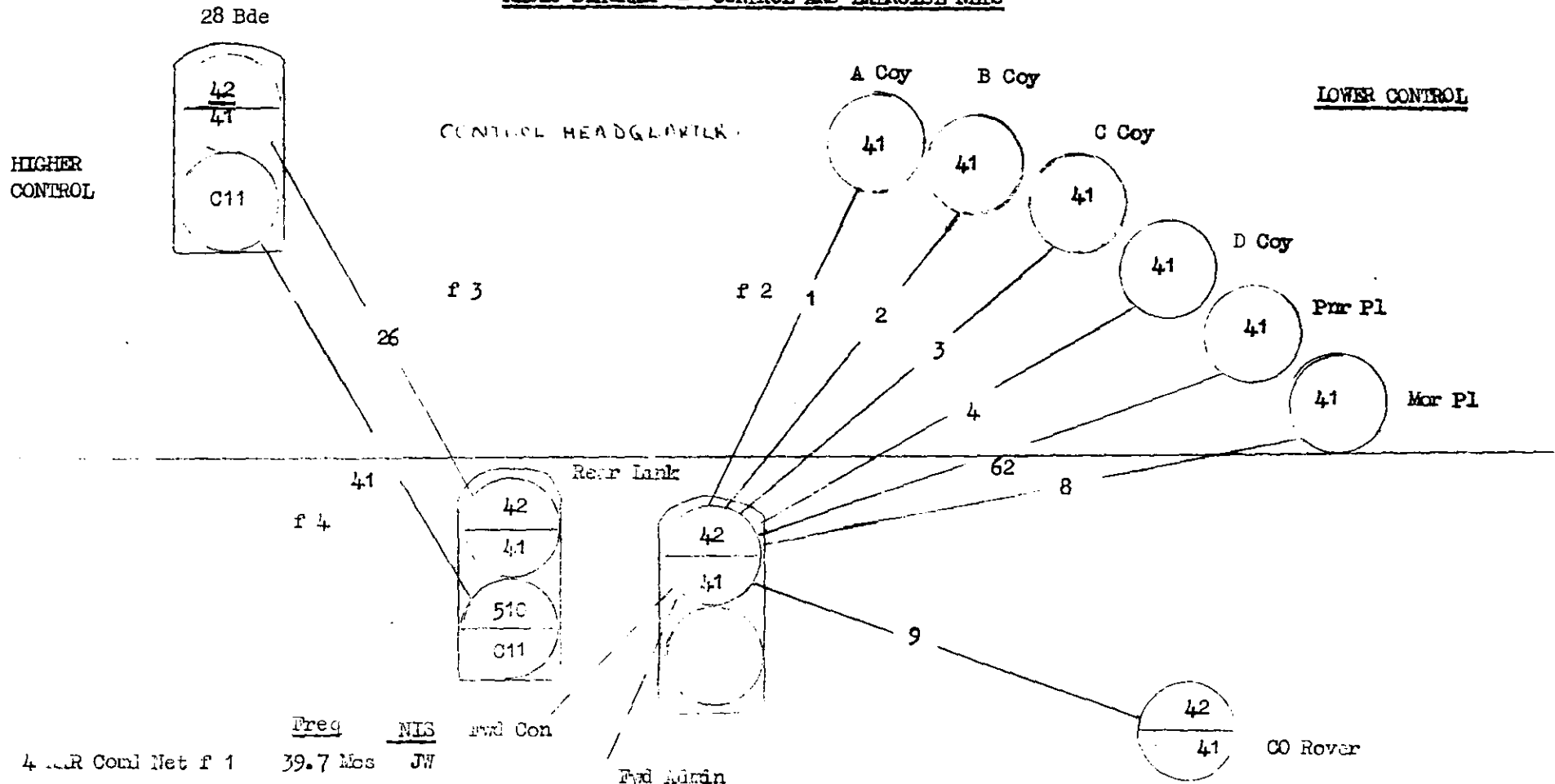

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GENERAL IDEA

1. During October 1965 an enemy force, the 1NZIS, made small landings in the MALACCA STATE. The initial landings were small recce groups of platoon strength. All landings that were made were NORTH of the SUNGAI LINGGI and considerable sabotage activities were carried out by the groups. It was thought that the total number of landings was six.

2. Small detachments of 28 Bde were mobilised to contain the hostile troops and prevent any further sabotage in the area. The hostile troops were contained until larger forces made landings in the MALACCA STATE. On 8 Nov a large force 501 Inf Regt was landed in the MALACCA STATE and their objective was found to be the capture of the MALACCA town (GR 1675).

3. When this intention became known units of 28 Bde were alerted and 4 R.R was given the task of preventing any enemy advance via the SUNGAI UDUNG ROAD. CO 4 R.R accordingly prepared his unit for battle and deployed along the SUNGAI UDUNG ROAD.

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SPECIAL IDEA

1. 4 R.R. was deployed on 14 Nov to prevent the enemy use of the SUNGAI UDUNG Road in the following locations.

2. The Bde HQ is located at TANGGA B.TU (055722).

3. Supporting 4 R.R. was a tp of 2 Recce Sqn which was acting as the bde screen. When contact was made with the screen on 14 Nov at MASJID TANAH (9984) the Bde Comd withdrew the screen. Small patrols were reported in the area of MASJID TANAH before the screen was withdrawn.

4. Upto 1000 hrs on 15 Nov small probes had been made of the forward company locations of A and C Coys. It is thought that 501 Regt is to launch a full regimental attack on the forward companies within the next 24 hours with a view to continuing the advance to MALCCA.

INDIVIDUAL SAFETY PRECAUTIONS WHEN SWIMMING AND BOATING

1. The attention of every individual is drawn to the importance of taking elementary but important safety precautions when swimming, boating or water skiing, whether on duty or for private recreation. In this theatre there is always a potential danger of drowning due to strong currents, tidal waves, snags, or stinging stings from fish which can cause a state of shock sufficient to make even a strong swimmer quite helpless in the water. These dangers especially apply to children and non swimmers.

2. Safety precautions are a matter of common sense. Certain parts of the coast and rivers are known to have dangerous currents, tides and rocks, and swimming and boating in these areas should be avoided.

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It is dangerous to swim immediately after a meal.

Swimmers, whether military or civilian are forbidden at any time to use boats such as canoes, sailing dinghies or small speed boats if not controlled by the Army, or Army sponsored clubs, unless the individual is wearing a life jacket.

It is most strongly recommended that whenever using any type of small boat the helmsman and all passengers wear life jackets, even if they are competent swimmers.
