Replacement

2. Due to the current shortage of officers in the ARA, delay is often experienced in notification being given as to the mane and movement details of nominated replacements. Normally the arrival date of a replacement will determine the actual date the outgoing officer is available for movement, taking into consideration the period of handover required and availability of berths on aircraft/shipping for the southbound journey. Therefore, the RTA date of an officer is often unconfirmed until his replacement has arrived.

- 3. Immediately advice is received of an officer's new posting, Part I of the attached Armex A will be completed by HQ ADF FARELF and idespatched to the unit which is to ensure as much of the form as possible is completed and returned to HQ AAF FARELF. Action will then be completed and signal advice given to the unit as to the actual date an officer is booked to RTA.
- 4. Attention is drawn to the notes in Annex 'A' attached. Any action contemplated in these matters must be submitted for consideration as early as possible.

370. DISCIPLINE - COMMONTEALTH CLUP

1. The following extracts from Garrison Standing Orders are republished for information and strict compliance:-

a. DRESS

Dress to be worn by nule military personnel within the Club is as follows:-

(a) Slacks, socks and shoes or sandals, or 'flip-flops' without socks, shirt with collar attached or 'T' shirt

- (3) Items of uniform must not be worn with civilian clothing, nor may 'flip-flops' or 'T' shirts be worn after 1900 hrs.
- (4) The wearing of swimming apparel is not permitted in the club after 1630 hrs.

b. OPENING HOURS

- (1) Daily except Saturdays 1000 hrs to 2230 hrs Open for meals and soft drinks.
- (2) Saturdays 1000 hrs to 2400 hrs.

(3) Bar times

- (a) Mon Fri (incl) . 1200 1400 hrs 1800 - 2230 hrs
- (b) Sat 1200 1400 hrs 1900 - 2330 hrs
- (c) Sun/Public Holidays 1200 1600 hrs 1900 - 2230 hrs.

(4) Closing

All members and guests must vacate the Club and be clear of it and the immediate area:

- (a) By 2300 hrs Daily except SATURDAY NIGHT
- (b) By 2400 hrs SATURDAY/SUNDAY NIGHT
- (5) An extension may be authorised in suitable circumstances.

c. CHILDREN

- (1) No child under 11 years of age is allowed on the Club premises or in the pool or immediate area unless accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult.
- (2) No children under the age of 17 years will be allowed in the Club after 1900 hrs.

d. ANIMALS

No animals are allowed in the Club or in the outside area where neals are served. All animals found in the Beach Club will be taken away and destroyed.

e. SWIMMING POOL

- (1) The Switting Pool will be open from 1000 hrs to 1907 hrs daily, except Monday from 0900 1100 hrs when the pool is closed for cleaning and traintenance.
- (2) Rules for the Swimming Pool, which are prominently displayed, must be complied with.
- (3) Parents are to exercise strong control of their children as there are no life cavers at the Pool.
- (4) The Club Committee accepts no responsibility for any incident resulting from lack of parental control, over children using the Pool.

f. ADMITTANCE

Members of the public and paid employees with the Garrison are NOT permitted access to the Club or its facilities unless invited and escorted by a member of the Club.

g. ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR

(1) All alcoholic liquor must be consumed within thirty minutes of bar closing times and all liquor not consumed in this time will be confiscated.

- (2) Bottles of Spirits will not be brought into the Club.
- (3) Bulk buying of beer and liquor is not allowed.
- (4) No child will be served with beer or spirits in any circumstances.
- (5) Members are not to take alcoholic liquor onto the beach or away from the Clubpremises.

h. DISCIPLINE

- (1) The Duty NCO will order anyone out of the Club who is either misbehaving or not complying with the Club rules.
- (2) The Duty NCO is required to submit a report of any incidents to the Secretary by 0900 hrs on the next working day after his tour of duty.

j. DUTY FREE BEER

- (1) Duty Free Beer will be served to members of the Armed Services or their families ONLY.
- (2) Other personnel using the Club will be required to purchase tax coupons.

372. DISCIPLINE - USE OF WRITTEN STATEMENTS AT SUMMARY HEARINGS

- 1. Attention is drawn to the note to para 31 g on page 28 of "The Administration of Discipline on War Service in Malaysia", where mention is unde of the practice of reading statements during a summary hearing instead of calling witnesses.
- 2. In such cases, the accused must be asked whether he wishes to cross-examine and if he so wishes, the witness must be called.
- 3. Where vital witnesses are not available, such a request by the accused may mean that it is difficult to prove a charge without considerable expense in assembling witnesses for the heuring. He must, however, be given the opportunity to cross examine, if he requests it.
- 4. In serious charges, the location of witnesses between the date of the offence and the hearing should be carefully watched and any possible difficulties in having witnesses available should be reported to the headquarters.
- 5. It is undesirable that the statements of witnesses forming part of an investigating officer's report be used as evidence as these statements frequently contain imagnissible evidence, eg. hearsay.
- 6. If it appears to be unavoidable, the statements of witnesses attached to an investigating officer's report may be used but the recommendations and conclusions of the investigating officer should not be used as they are not evidence.
- 7. Attention is also drawn to para 23 b. (5) on page 21 of "The Administration of Discipline on War Service in Malaysia" which refers to the use

of the words "documentary evidence" in the column of Charge and Offence Reports (MF M's), headed "Names of Vitnesses". The names of the persons whose written statements are used should be inserted. The word "documentary" is only used in the column for the names of witnesses where part of the evidence is a particular document such as a written order.

373. RETURN TO AUSTRALIA BY SEA

- 1. The majority of Australian personnel serving in 20 COMADL Inf Dde are tentatively scheduled to be relieved during the period Sep Oct 67. Charter Aircraft will be used for this relief.
- 2. It is essential that the maximum use be made of these aircraft, and, in particular, that the number of scats not filled be kept to a minimum. During this relief, all members and families returning to Australia will be required to move by air. Application for approval to move by sea will be considered only if supported by medical certificates.
- 3. The period Sep Oct 67 is tentative and the relief may be brought forward or postponed. If changes do occur, any approvals already granted for movement by sea during the actual periods of the relief will be cancelled.

- 1. With the conclusion of confrontation and the current operational situation the situation in accordance with paras 40 (b), 41 and 44 (b) of the above reference can now be reassessed in relation to Arms Kotes.
- 2. With effect from receipt of this order:
 - a. A soldier/storeman; will always sleep in each sub-unit Arms Kote this will be the sub-unit's responsibility.
 - b. By day a duty arms kote storeman will always be present within the Kote unless it is locked and secured.
 - c. After dark, when all Arms Kotes will be included in beat of the roving sentry from No 4 Post of the Battalion Quarter Guard, the Arms Kote may, provided it has been locked by the storeman referred to in para (a), be left temporarily unmanned. (This is provided the storeman eventually returns to sleep within the Arms Kote).
 - d. The company Orderly Corporal at the conclusion of training will check the Arms Kote with the Arms Kote day storeman, the night relief and the company Quarter Master Sergeant to ensure all weapons are accounted for.
 - e. The orderly corporal will note in his Log Book the time that this security check has been carried out and the result; he will report the result of such check to the Orderly Sergeant.
 - f. Discrepancies will be immediately reported to the Orderly Officer and the Adjutant. Thilst awaiting direction as to subsequent action an investigation of such discrepancies will be commenced by the Company Commander concerned.
